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TLV BOARD PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Mission Statement of Twin Lakes Village reads as follows:

The mission of Twin Lakes Village Property Owners Association is to provide a positive sense of community for the benefit of the entire membership, while maintaining a secure and active quality of life and a strong financial position to support the high quality of all amenities and property values, through the efforts of dedicated volunteers supported by a professional staff.

"Dedicated volunteers" – a key value of our community and one that is recognized in this mission statement. Did you know that our standing committees consist of 52 volunteers, and that doesn't include members who volunteer their time on the activities committee and in support of our golf clubs and other member groups, nor the members who participate each year in Highway 41 cleanup, divot parties, planting parties, and fund raising events, nor the members who serve on condo association boards. I'm sure I have not named all the volunteer opportunities available in the Village, (and I apologize for any missed) but as you see, the list is long.

Being a member of the Board of Directors is also a volunteer position. While the time commitment varies from year to year and from month to month, the emotional commitment is consistent and substantial.

Three members recently volunteered to run for the open positions on the board – Dale Hendrickson, Sara Thweatt and Carole' Jenness. Thank you to each of them for their willingness to serve our community.

After a winter without regularly scheduled board meetings, the board resumed regular meetings in April. Actions taken included:

Putting a proposal to change the date and time of the annual meeting to August to a vote of the membership. Please be sure to vote on this proposal when you receive your ballot this month.

Approving the lease of boat slips to jet skis. This is a decision that will be in effect for this year. Ongoing leases for jet skis will be considered as we consider terms of our boat slip lease policy for the long term.

Approving the sale of bundled golf as a scholarship fundraiser. We are proud to be a part of our membership's commitment to the youth of our school district.

Approving the installation of a streetlight at the intersection of Village Blvd. and Lakeview Ct. This action was taken as the result of the research and recommendation of the Landscape Committee. Thank you.

Approving the PayLease system of accepting credit card payment of association fees. The board had previously decided not to accept credit card payments because of the fees that were charged to the association as a whole. Board member, Gale Salo, did some research and found through conversation with TLV members that the PayLease option was available at minimal cost to the association. This is not a perfect solution as some costs are passed on to members who are using credit cards and a minimal charge is paid by the association, but it allows us to make this method of payment available without adding unreasonable costs to the association as a whole.

For those who have been here throughout the winter and for those who have already returned, aren't we having a delightful spring? For those who have not yet returned to your village home, better get here quick because it's awfully nice!

Men's League Rosters Held at 5 Players for 2015

Teams in the TLV Men's League will be held to a five-man roster for the coming season.

The action was taken by the Men's Club membership at its September meeting. Many expressed the view that by limiting the play to a four-man format, with only one substitute on the roster there was an opportunity to expand the number of teams.

With just three or four more teams for 2015, the Men's Club would be able to break into two divisions, with each assigned to the front or back-nine for the league play.

In other action the members voted to drop the minimum age for players to 18 years old. Again, the action was approved after several members said they could get more players and teams, if younger golfers were eligible.

MEN'S CLUB DUES/GHIN FEES FOR 2015

2015 Men's Club dues are now payable, and can be sent to the Pro Shop at Twin Lakes.

For \$136, members receive their GHIN, Club Dues and Tournament Fees. For members who hold a GHIN through another club, there is \$31 cost reduction.

Full Tournament Schedule Spring/Summer/Fall

The season kicks off May 16 with the Spring Meeting, and an Individual Stroke Play tournament.

The meeting will be held at 11 a.m., followed by a free luncheon. The shotgun tournament begins at 1 p.m. with members competing in the individual flight competition. Signup deadline is 5 p.m. Friday, May 15.

Again this summer the Club hopes to organized special outings, such as the popular trip to Galena Ridge. Once again the club will see if other Men's Club are interested in a home-to-home event.

For \$80 members are eligible to play in all \$25 events.

For those who chose not to pay the \$80 before May 17, there will be a \$25 fee to enter individual tournaments.

New this summer will be the President's Ryder Cup and Dinner, Sept. 12. Limited to 30 players, two captains will draft a team of 15, and a Ryder Cup format will be used -- to be announced later. Signup deadline for the Ryder is Sept. 6.

competing at age 11, but it was on the senior circuit after age 55 that she played her best. She never had a lot of power but controlled games from the no-man's land in the middle of the court. Cheney was inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame in 2004. She was quoted as saying, "I never practiced or trained, I just had a darn good time."




