- Be a fully-enrolled graduating senior of a Lakeland School District high school and must have attended a Lakeland District high school for a minimum of two years.
- Have a GPA of 2.8 or above.
- Demonstrate financial need.
- Attend an eligible **post-secondary institution in Idaho** as a full-time student within the first two terms following high school graduation.
- Pursue a course of study leading to a first degree, certificate or other approved award.

To be complete, the Application Packet must include:

Application form, typed or printed legibly in ink.
Official transcript showing GPA and rank in class.
Two letters of reference which address your accomplishments, leadership, and personal qualities. They must be from individuals who are unrelated to you, one of which must be a school faculty member or administrator. References need to be signed and preferably on office letterhead.
School, Community and Employment Resume (see page 2 of form).
Essay of a minimum of 300 words (see page 2 of form).
All required signatures.

If awarded a scholarship: the recipient **must attend a Twin Lakes Village Board** workshop or meeting to be introduced (date and time to be specified at a later date), and **must provide a follow-up report** about their post-secondary educational experience to date and future educational plans to the TLV Scholarship Committee by May 1, 2025.

TWIN LAKES VILLAGE SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE 10 TIPS FOR WRITING EFFECTIVE SCHOLARSHIP ESSAYS

- 1. Read the instructions and make sure you understand them before you start writing.
- 2. Think about what you are going to write and organize your thoughts before you start writing.
- 3. Begin the writing process by writing an outline.
- 4. Make sure your outline touches on every aspect required by the instructions.
- 5. Write your essay by elaborating on each of the points in your outline.
- 6. Use clear, concise and simple language throughout the essay.
- 7. State your accomplishments without coming across as if you are bragging.
- 8. Make sure your grammar and spelling are impeccable.
- 9. Read the question again and then read your essay to be certain the essay addresses each point.
- 10. Have someone with strong writing and editing skills proofread the essay before you submit it.
