

TWIN LAKES VILLAGE (TLV) WOMEN'S 18-HOLE GOLF CLUB

STANDING RULES

Revised and amended: 5/9/23

1. **Tuesday Non-Tournament Club Play**

- All players should sign in for play one half hour before tee time.
- Line-up shall be directed by the 2nd Vice President (line-up coordinator).
- Entry fees for weekly play shall be determined by the Executive Board.
- Weekly winner's names will be posted as soon as determined.
- Awards will be given weekly, monthly and/or annually as determined by the Executive Board.

2. **Hole-In-One**

- A hole in one can occur anytime during the year when the TLV golf course is open.
- A hole in one must be made on the first shot with at least one witness.
- The player must complete a minimum of 9 holes.
- The player must turn the scorecard in with the date & at least 2 signatures (player & witness) to the Pro Shop.
- Collection of entry fee begins at the Spring General Meeting and payout will take place at the following year's Spring General Meeting.
- If more than one Hole-In-One is made in the year, the fund will be split equally.
- Players may enter at any time during the year (May to May). Hole-in-One eligibility starts when the entry fee is paid.

3. **Eclectic**

- Posted scores from Tuesday play and Club Sponsored events are recorded except for the second day of the Belle Ringer and Solheim Cup.
- Collection of entry fee begins at the Spring General Meeting and payout will take place during the EOY Banquet.
- All awards will be determined on NET scores for individual players.

4. **The Vicki Stuart Memorial Award** (most improved) will be based on USGA Index. Those with an established handicap will start at golf season opening. Those who need to establish handicaps will start at that point. To be eligible for the Vicki Stuart Memorial Award, a player must post at least eight (8) club sponsored event scores.

5. **PMA – Positive Mental Attitude**

The annual PMA award goes to the golfer, selected by her fellow TLV 18-hole club members, who exudes a Positive Mental Attitude during and around golf play. She is the golfer who positively approaches the game, exuding an optimistic attitude toward herself, others, and the game. She can be a first-time award winner or a repeat.

Note: These Standing Rules may be amended at any time by a majority vote of the Executive Board.
