CLUB RULES

1. Sign up for the following weeks play will be done electronically thru Golf Genius. Check your email Thursday for your invitation to play from Patti Arnold or Katy O'Neal and respond by 5pm Tuesday. You will receive a confirmation email from noreply@golfgenius.com with your selection of either "Playing" or "Not Playing". From this confirmation email you can change your original selection, but this must be done by 5pm Tuesday to be included in the lineup. Issues or questions should be directed to:

2. Meet on the back deck 30 minutes before play.
3. Tee time in April, May, June and September is 9am. Tee time in July and August is 8am.
4. All players should keep a scorecard for each player in the group. At the end of the round compare scores amongst each other. One scorecard (the Master Card) should be signed by all players and deposited in the green box by the computer in the golf shop after play. One player should maintain a picture of the submitted master card in the event of a discrepancy. Issues or questions should be directed to:

5. Current handicaps will be used at the beginning of the season. New members must establish their handicap before they are eligible for weekly prizes. Once 54 holes are posted in GHIN a handicap can be established.
6. Maximum allowed posting scores per hole: A score equal to the *par* of a hole plus two strokes and adjusted for any handicap strokes applied on that hole. A *net double bogey* is a player's maximum hole score for handicap purposes.
7. Each player is required to pay the annual dues, which includes \$30 for the weekly low gross/low net and chip in prizes.
8. A Guest may play twice without paying their membership and prize money fee. The Guest must pay the Golf Shop for their green fees and cart, unless they are a TLV Member.

TLV LOCAL RULES

1. Free Relief is allowed from Abnormal Course Conditions, which include Immovable Obstructions (cart paths, flower beds) and any marked area of Ground Under Repair.

The Relief Area for dropping a ball is within one club-length of the Reference Point (the nearest point of complete relief), no nearer to the hole and in the same area of the course.

2. Keep your power carts on the cart path around the greens and tees or 30 feet away from these areas where no cart path exists.
3. Each 9 holes of golf should be played in 2 hours and 15 minutes or less.
4. Penalty Area: All bodies of water on the course are considered Red Penalty Areas, with the edge defined by their natural boundaries (where the ground slopes down to form the depression) when not marked by lines or stakes.
5. Obstruction Relief for the left side of 13: There is a drop area when your ball is between the fence and the concrete barrier that can be used when standard relief options are not available.
6. When feasible finish putting out if the stance and lie allows.
7. Proper golf type attire is required—Please observe current dress code :
No tank tops, spaghetti straps, swim wear or torn denim will be allowed.

Play Ready Golf!

PLAY READY GOLF

1. Tee off when "Ready"... No honors.
2. If you think or know your tee shot is out of bounds, hit a second shot after announcing to your group you are hitting a provisional ball.
3. In the fairway... hit when "Ready".
4. Please park your cart as close to your ball as practical to help minimize walking time but not past the white cart exit line.
5. Stay "Ready" within one stroke of the group ahead of yours.
6. Putt out if "Ready" (See #6 under TLV Local Rules).
7. If the flagstick is left in the hole, there is no penalty if the ball strikes the flagstick, even if the stroke is made from the putting green. Players must decide before making a stroke whether to have the flagstick removed, attended or left in the hole.
8. Move forward to next tee box and share scores.

GOLF ETIQUETTE

1. Assure the previous group is out of range before hitting your ball.
2. Play "Ready Golf", get up and tee off without delay.
3. Hit at the same time as another player if you are on opposite side of the fairway.
4. Be thinking of which club to use while approaching the ball. Walk to your ball with a couple of club selections.
5. Don't talk after a player has addressed the ball.
6. Spend no more than 3 minutes looking for a lost ball.
7. Mark your ball on the green.
8. Allow the player furthest away from the hole on the green to putt first. Finish out putting if the stance and line allow, this speeds up play greatly.
9. Replace divots, enter trap from low side and rake traps before leaving.
10. Leave your push carts or drive carts in a position that will allow quick movement off the green towards the next tee.
11. Move to the next tee before recording scores.
12. Replace all your divots in the fairway and the roughs and repair all your ball marks on the green.
13. Keep walking carts off the greens and skirts.

SCORING

Keep **two scores for all players** in the group on each hole.

1. Record the **Total number of strokes**; number of times hitting the ball between tee and into the hole. **A whiff (swing and miss ball) is counted as a stroke.**
2. Record the number of those strokes that were **putts** (number of strokes on the green).

After completing each hole, **move to the next tee box**. Compare score cards to confirm the scoring is the **same** on all cards.

Players are encouraged to **pick up** their ball if they have taken 11 strokes and have not completed the hole. Record the score as **"11"** and place an **X** over it. If a player is **on the green** in 11 strokes, it is okay to finish out the hole by putting. The result is a stroke score of 12 or more and is recorded as such. If the player's true stroke score is 11, record 11 and **DO NOT** put an "X" over the number.

If the player **Birdied** the hole (1 less than Par), circle (○) the score.

If the player **Chipped In**, place a (*) next to the score and record 0 for putts.

After completing play:

1. Add both the total stroke scores and then add putting scores separately
2. Compare the cards among the playing partners to ensure accuracy (including the total score for the round)
3. All players must **sign the Master Card** for the round to be posted in GHIN

AWARDS & RECOGNITION

Weekly awards for:

- Birdies (A, B, C, D Flights)
- Chip-Ins
- Low Gross (A, B, C, D Flights)
- Low Net (A, B, C, D Flights)

Each player is required to pay the annual dues, which includes \$30 for the weekly low gross/low net and chip in prizes. Weekly prizes are paid in credits at the Pro Shop under winner's names.

Monthly awards for:

- Lowest Number of Putts

Yearly awards for:

- Flights A, B, C, D, Low Gross & Low Net
- Flights A, B, C, D, Eclectic Awards
- Club Champion
- Most Improved Handicap
- DiDi Genduso Inspirational Award
- Hole-In-One Award

THE CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

In order to qualify for the Club Championship, you must have previously played and posted at least five games with the 9-Hole Club

If you play with our club in an Invitational Tournament at another course, this will qualify you towards your five rounds. Assure your scores are recorded with our Scorekeeper Chair before the Championship Tournament Games begin.

The Club Championship will be played on four consecutive Thursdays:

- August 27th, September 3rd, September 10th & September 17th

Your BEST front nine game score and BEST back game score will count as your final score. There are no make-up games. The winners of the Club Championship Games will be announced at our "End of the Year" luncheon on September 24th.
